

2nd Grade English Curriculum Sample





Capitalization



Teaching Tip: Students should already be familiar with capitalization, especially capitalizing the first word in a sentence and the word "I." Be sure to emphasize that you only capitalize "I" when it stands alone in a sentence.

- (1) The first word of each sentence
- (2) Using the word "I"

Example: When I was younger, I wanted to be a nurse.



Teaching Tip: Students will be less familiar with proper nouns. Write the categories of proper nouns (listed below) on the board or a separate sheet of paper. Have students give you examples of each category without looking at this example sheet. For even more practice, have students write their examples in a sentence.

EX: States \rightarrow Ohio, Washington I live in Washington.


